Elevation Certificate Training

FEMA's Elevation Certificate (EC) is an important administrative tool of the National Flood Insurance Program. It is used to determine the proper flood insurance premium rates; it can be used to document elevation information necessary to ensure compliance with community floodplain regulations; and it may be used to support a request for a Letter of Map Amendment (LOMA) or Letter of Map Revision based on fill (LOMR-F).

A new EC was approved for use, effective February 13, 2006, through February 28, 2009.

What's New?

- Format of the EC has been modified.
- Instructions have been modified to provide better guidance.
- Two pages have been added for attaching two or more color photographs of the building.
- Certifiers are now required to provide the square footage of the enclosed area and/or attached garages below the elevated floor.

The State Department of Land and Natural Resources and FEMA Region IX will be co-hosting an Elevation Certificate Training Workshop on August 14 and 21, 2006. Come and learn how to properly complete the new EC.
