Research at the University of Hawai'i – Breaking New Ground

The research enterprise at the University of Hawaii has experienced unparalleled growth in the past 5 years and it is poised to expand even further. Equally impressive is the breadth of activities that have local, national, and international relevance.

Research and training grants and contracts coming to the university total nearly \$400 million dollars in the most recent reporting period. The National Science Foundation ranks us number 25 in the country among public universities for federal expenditures on research.

But the numbers tell only part of the story, according to our speaker, Dr. Gary K. Ostrander, UH Manoa Vice Chancellor for Research and Graduate Education.

Dr. Ostrander came to UH Manoa in late 2004 from Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore where he was Associate Provost for Research and Chair of the Graduate Board. Ostrander was also head of a lab that conducted research on aspects of coral biology related to the development of cancer. He has also focused his research on the worldwide deterioration of coral reef ecosystems.

Dr. Ostrander has two guest speakers for the January luncheon program. **Dr. Rolf-Peter Kudritzki** is the Director of the UH Institute for Astronomy that watches over observatories on the Big Island and Maui. Hawaii's observatories are the best in the world for ground-based astronomy. **Dr. Peter Crouch** is the new Dean of the UH College of Engineering, who came to Manoa from Arizona State University where he took the program there to new heights.
